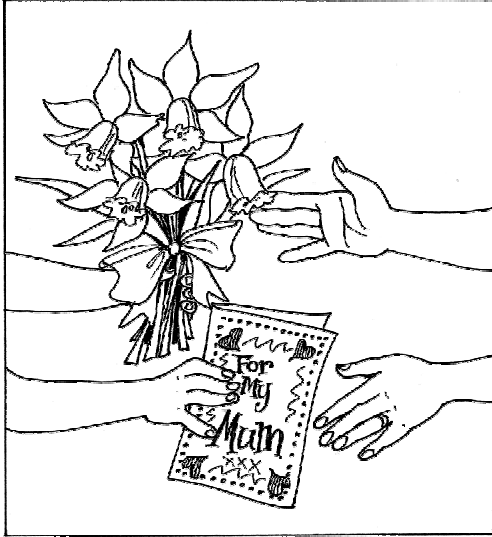


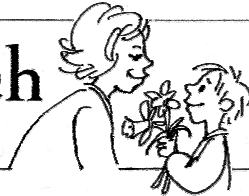

From the Vicar

Dear Reader,

It's been a difficult month, what with snow like we've not had for quite a few years in this country and forest fires in Australia . Indeed, it's been a difficult few months with the near collapse of the banking system as we know it, and the disappearance of much-loved shops like Woolworths.

Of course, for those directly affected, it can have had devastating impact, with jobs lost, homes repossessed and even lives lost—over 180 known in the Australian fires so far.

And for many it's a very worrying time—is it safe to go outside and risk the snow? Or will my pension or savings be safe for as long as I need them, or provide enough for my to live as I expected? Or what will others think when they find out I've been made redundant after so many years?

It seems as though many of the things we took for granted are now up in the air again, and what does the future hold?

We might think it's all beyond our control, and certainly not fair. We can't stop the snow falling, or the banks closing, can we? And we certainly didn't cause this all to happen to us—we were just going about our own business, getting on with life the best we could, not hurting others if we could help it, but concentrating on looking after my family.

Well, we might not cause the snow to fall, but maybe our response could have been different? Instead of the torrents of complaints about schools closing, how many people helped an elderly or inform neighbour clear their paths or help them with their shopping when they couldn't get out?

And incredibly it seems that some of the fires in Australia were started deliberately! People can do some amazingly stupid (or evil?) things sometimes.

And what about the banking collapse? Surely that was all the fault of the top bankers trying to make as much money as they could without understanding or recognising the risks involved? And didn't they just apologise for it all?

Well, yes and no, it seems. They certainly seemed to apologise, but when pressed to say how they might have been responsible in some way, they seemed to suggest that actually it wasn't their fault at all, but 'market forces' or something beyond their control.

But is that true? Was it some mysterious force outside their control, or indeed outside our control?

I suspect that actually something else was going on, and we are all part of the problem. We only need to look at how many people do the lottery every week. Why? I could be wrong, but I suspect that it's not so that their money will go to a 'good cause'!

It's because deep down many of us have fallen for the lie that money will bring us security and peace, the sort of life that somehow we deserve. And so money has become the greatest force in the world. We don't even question that.

Don't believe me? If I said something was 'uneconomical' would you imagine that was a good thing or a bad thing?

Actually, it doesn't tell you anything about it. We've made a judgement on the basis of money—nothing else. Finance has become the judge. In the old days, we would have said it had become a god. And that seems to have happened to those top bankers. Of course, they said sorry, but were they truly?

It seems to me that blaming someone or something else rather than ourselves is not saying sorry. Saying sorry begins when we recognise that we have been responsible for our actions, not matter how much pressure we may have felt under at the time. Only by recognising our own part in this can we begin to change. For if our sorry doesn't lead to a change in our actions, it's not much of a sorry at all, just an attempt to get out of paying for our mistakes.

And that's where so many of us are. It's someone else's fault. I couldn't help it. What can I do? And so things don't change. We try various ways of propping up the system, when what's needed is a new system.

Traditionally at this time of year Christians have given up something important to them during Lent—be it eating rich foods, chocolate, alcohol, watching TV or whatever—and in doing so recognising that there are more important things in life. And the time is used instead to reflect on our life, the things that I have done wrong, and what I might do differently so that things change.

This Lent, will you carry on as usual, or find time to think about yourself, and perhaps discover that even though we all make mistakes and get things wrong, God is still there, to forgive and to give us strength to change—to get the right things in the right order of priority in our lives?

FINDING GOD IN EACH MOMENT OF THE DAY

Do you know the popular series of books entitled *Where's Wally*? These books are filled with very detailed cartoon drawings in each of which is hidden Wally. He is dressed in a red and white striped ski cap and glasses and the challenge is to find Wally. You have to search for some time to pick him out of the crowd, but Wally is always there!

In many ways, like finding Wally, we need to develop the skill of identifying God's presence in our daily lives. One approach that can help us to find God throughout the day is to do a daily review of our day with God. It can provide us with a means of seeing where God has been at work during our day. It's an opportunity of remembering how God has been at work and how we have responded to him. As the psalmist says, 'On my bed I remember you; I think of you through the watches of the night' (Ps 63:6).



What does this look like in practice? Here is a step by step guide:

1. Be still for a moment, and quiet your mind.
2. Acknowledge that Jesus is present. Invite him to guide you.
3. Recall the beginning of the day, when you first woke up. Watch that scene, as if on film. What is your reaction to what you see? Talk to God about it.
4. Continue through the film of your day, going from scene to scene. As you reflect on each one, some scenes may fill you with gratitude, others with regret. Speak directly to God about this. You may also want to pray for those you encountered during the day.
5. End your review with a prayer of thanksgiving for God's mercy and love. Ask him to refresh you as you sleep.

As you begin reviewing your day with God regularly, you can expect to see two things beginning to happen:

Firstly, you will become more aware of recurring negative patterns in your life, which will challenge these wrong attitudes and habits and increase your desire to grow and change.

Secondly, you will become more aware of God's presence in the ordinary moments of your life. And when you start experiencing the reality of God's presence with you every day, it's not ordinary any more!

The proposal amount to the amalgamation of churches and parishes, which means that some priests will be looking after more than one parish. There are four proposals to choose from. The plan is to reduce the number of parish clergy by a third. Some priests will be retiring and as numbers for ordination are on the decrease they may not be replaced.

Barrie Kitchen delivered his annual budget and showed again that he is a master of juggling our finances. He mentioned the fact that we would benefit financially from increased giving.

The meeting ended with the grace.

Wishing you all a wonderful Lenten Season filled with Peace, Love and Happiness

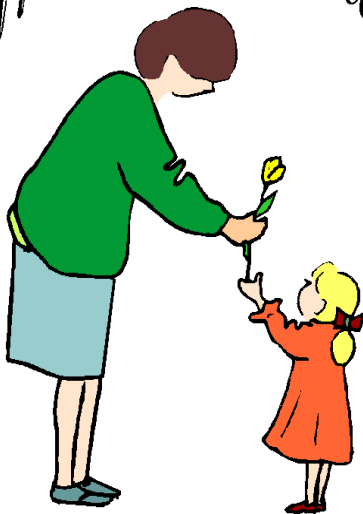

New prayers for those made redundant - published on C of E website

The Church of England has published two new prayers to comfort people made redundant, and those remaining in the workplace following a round of redundancies, at the beginning of a year in which the Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development has predicted that at least 600,000 people could lose their jobs.

The 'Prayer on being made redundant' helps to put into words the anxieties of those who are losing - or who have already lost - their job in the wave of recent redundancies.

The 'Prayer for those remaining in the workplace' focuses on the guilt and increased workload associated with redundancy.

The prayers emphasise how the Church is there for people at all times - especially in times of crisis.

Prayer for those remaining in the workplace

Life has changed:
colleagues have gone - redundant, out of work.
Suddenly, what seemed so secure is now so very fragile.

It's hard to know what I feel:
sadness, certainly,
guilt, almost, at still having a job to go to,
and fear of the future:
who will be next?
how will I cope with the increased pressure of work?

Lord Jesus, in the midst of this uncertainty, help me to keep going:
to work to the best of my ability,
taking each day at a time,
and taking time each day to walk with you
for you are the way, the truth and the life. Amen.

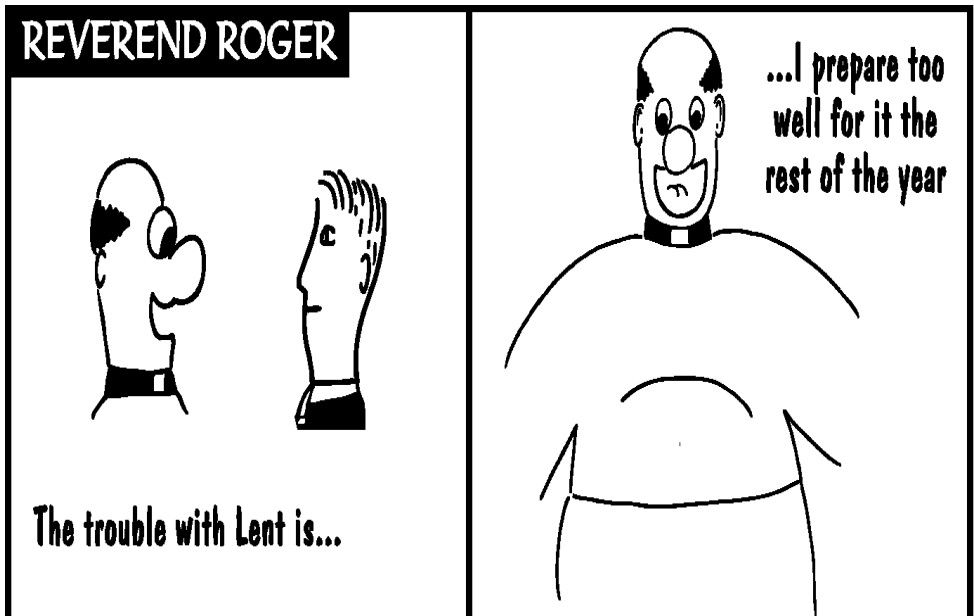

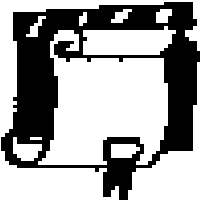
Annual Parochial Church Meeting
