

Information for taxi drivers...



You will have seen Street Angels dressed in yellow jackets walking around Halifax town centre between 9 pm and 3 am on most Friday and Saturday nights. ***We just want to tell you a bit about ourselves so that you know what we are doing and why.***

We are mostly volunteers from the different local churches and we are based at the Fair Trade Cafe in Crossley Street. We have the aim of making Halifax a safer and better place and showing God's love on the streets.

We walk around keeping an eye open for vulnerable people who might have had too much to drink, especially young women and under age drinkers. Our own volunteers and St John Ambulance volunteers assist where there have been minor injuries from falls or fights or where perhaps drinks have been 'spiked'.

We began this work November 2005 and the

police tell us that anti-social behaviour and violence on Friday and Saturday nights has greatly reduced.

We are really pleased to find that Halifax is fast becoming a safer place at night - but there are of course still people who cause trouble and people who fall victim to the binge drinking culture that seems so popular with young people!

If you want to make contact with us for help with vulnerable people just ask someone carrying a radio link (pub/club doormen have radios) and request assistance from the Fair Trade Cafe. If you ever fancy a biscuit or cup of tea drop into the cafe! You will be most welcome.

Yours is an essential, though at times difficult job working antisocial hour and we hope you keep safe and well
