2011 is the European Year of Volunteering with a theme of **Volunteer - Make a Difference!** The year will highlight different volunteering opportunities



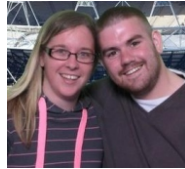
starting in January & February with a focus on poverty and homelessness; March & April on young people; May & June culture and arts; July & August sport; September & October environment and animals; November & December health and social care.

On Saturday September 18th 2010 Arun Angels formed a guard of honour at the wedding of one of their team members Steve Avery at Opengate Church, Bognor Regis.

Steve first met his wife Marcia in 2006 while serving as a volunteer in her church in Porto Alegre, Brazil. Romanced blossomed and on May 21st 2010 they had the first of three wedding ceremonies when Steve (in the UK) married Marcia (in Brazil) by proxy in the Registry Office in Porto Alegre. A church wedding followed in Brazil on August 18th.



The blessing on their wedding in Bognor Regis enabled friends here to share their happiness. Their honeymoon was a short one as Steve was back on the streets of Bognor with Arun Angels the following weekend.

On Saturday 18th November, around 150 people gathered in Southampton from across the southern region representing a range of different Street Pastor, Angel or similar schemes. The purpose was to give thanks to God for what he is doing across the projects and then to share stories and news to encourage one another.

The afternoon started with a time of worship led by David, the co-ordinator from Isle of Wight Street Pastors and who has written a street pastor song which tells a story that is familiar to many of us involved in late night projects - <http://www.iowstreetpastors.org.uk/downloads/>

There were three invited speakers including Les Isaacs from Ascension Trust, Inspector Phil Bates from Hampshire Police and John Burke the licensing manager from Southampton council. In attendance were 16 project co-ordinators, nearly 100 street team volunteers and over 30 other supporters including prayer partners, members of management groups and trustees. To give a flavour of what is happening across the region, we heard a brief update from 6 different projects. Friends

from Salisbury shared about their prayer network with some great ideas for getting prayer partners involved. We heard from Arun Angels and the challenges of working when, at times, Police resource is committed elsewhere. We heard about a new School Pastors scheme in Fair Oak, a very new Safe Space project that has grown out of 4 years Street Pastor work in Portsmouth and a Saturday morning Healing On The Streets initiative that grew out of the late night Street Pastor scheme in Weymouth.

After a break for a feast of cakes, buns, pastries and other delights that everyone had brought along, we went off into smaller groups to allow everyone to share highlights from their own project. We closed by praying for the region. The feedback that we've had has been really encouraging and there are already plans for something similar next year.
