Cherry, American Prunus serotina USA	Reddish-brown to red	Cabinet making, Furniture, Interior joinery
Iroko Milicia excelsa. M. regia W Africa	Yellow-brown	Exterior and interior joinery, Bench tops, Constructional work.
Maple, soft Acer, sacchannum A rubrum N America	Creamy white	Furniture, Interior joinery, Turnery.
Meranti, dark red/dark reed seraya/red lauan Shorea spp S E Asia	Medium to dark red-brown	Interior and exterior joinery, Plywood
Oak, American White Quercus spp N America	Pale yellow to mid-brown	Furniture, Cabinet work, Interior and exterior joinery, Flooring, Tight cooepage.
Oak, European Quercus robur, Q.petraea Europe	Yellowish-brown	Furniture, Interior and exterior joinery, Flooring, Tight cooepage, Fencing.
Sapele Entandrophragma cylindricum West Africa	Medium reddish-brown with marked stripe figure	Joinery, Furniture. Flooring.
Tulipwood/Poplar, American yellow Linodendron tulipifera N America	Yellowish to olive brown with dark stains	Joinery, Furniture.
