



Bulky waste collection service

A1 Housing's Mobile Caretaking Service can collect your bulky household items and white goods for a small charge.

This service is available to A1 Housing tenants, in addition to the Bassetlaw District Council collection service. Both services carry the same charge.

The charge for this service is £5.20 per item.

For example - a three-piece suite will cost $3 \times £5.20 = £15.60$.

By using this service you will also be helping the environment as all bulky waste collected in the district can now be recycled instead of going to landfill.

To use this service please contact A1 Housing on Freephone 0800 590542. You can also request this service directly with our Caretakers when you see them in your area.

Payment should be made by cash and cheques directly to the collecting team, who will always issue you with an official A1 Housing receipt.

Items for collection should be left accessible outside the property.

Items we WILL collect include:

Beds, three-piece suites, tables, chairs, wardrobes, sideboards, wall units, dressing tables, chests of drawers, carpets, general items of household furniture, washing machines, cookers, fridges, freezers, fridge/freezers, microwaves, tumble driers, televisions.

Items we WILL NOT collect include:

Garden waste, tree/shrub pruning's, building rubble/material, fireplaces, concrete, window frames, doors, glass, batteries, tyres, baths, kitchen units, wc pans, wash hand basins, gas fires, boilers, radiators, fencing, garden sheds, asbestos, pianos, car parts, bicycles/motorcycles, mowers/garden machinery, other household fixtures and fittings.

You can also take many of the items above to the two Household Waste Recycling Centres in Bassetlaw located at:

- Shireoaks Road, Worksop
- Hallcroft, Retford

Please note that flytipping is criminal activity mainly covered by the Environmental Protection Act 1990 punishable upon conviction in a Magistrates Court by fines of up to £50,000 and/or 12 months' imprisonment.
